PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS

Trunk: The trunk is straight, cylindrical, can grow up to 49 feet with spreading branches.
Leaves: The leaves are elliptical, thick, 8-12 inches long and 2-3 inches wide.
Flowers: Clustered, small, yellowish - white or yellowish - green coloured flower.
Fruit: It has a berry type fruit.

DISTRIBUTION AND HABITAT

Native to tropical areas of South India and widely seen in Asia. It requires 700-4000mm of rainfall per year.

CULTIVATION AND USES

The trunk was once used in the making of masts for sailing ships. Leaves are used as medicines in treatment of fever, skin diseases, diabetes.

INTERESTING FACTS

This evergreen tree is a center of attraction in many gardens in India. It's known to be effective to alleviate noise. Provide shelter and food for many animals, such as birds, bat, etc.
