Flowers: White or pale yellow, star shaped, small.

Fruits: Smooth, dark purple, juicy, 2-3 inches long and 0.6-08 inches wide.

Black jamun is a species of tree native of Indian Subcontinent, South East Asia. It is introduced and naturalized in Africa, Oceania and Pacific Islands.

CULTIVATION AND USES

It is rich in vitamins, minerals, antioxidants, flavonoids. The fruits are used to make syrups, juice and used in traditional medicine practice.

Black jamun is mentioned in ancient Indian texts like the Mahabharata and Charaka Samhita.
